### **PUBLIC ASKED TO HELP MONITOR FUNDY SHORELINE**

The Fundy Baykeeper invites the public to help make a difference toward a cleaner, healthier Bay of Fundy and New Brunswick coast, by becoming a **Bay of Fundy shoreline steward**.

Two workshops will be held, one in St. Andrews and one in Saint John. At these workshops Fundy Baykeeper volunteers will receive training in the nuts and bolts of how to observe, document and report about conditions, significant changes, wildlife, pollution, litter and other concerns that could affect the Bay of Fundy Beach or section of shoreline they would like to adopt to monitor and steward.

"This is a way people can get directly involved in protecting and preserving our coastal environment and the Bay of Fundy", said Fundy Baykeeper, David Thompson.

The workshop in St. Andrews will take place on Saturday, May 3rd, from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. (lunch provided) at the Clarke House, 63 Princess Royal St. Saint John's workshop will be on Sunday, May 4th, from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., at Linden Place, 199 Chesley St. (at the Saint John office of the Fundy Baykeeper in the Acadian bus station building.)

Help build an ongoing network of shoreline stewards, by adopting and reporting on a stretch of shoreline near your home, anywhere between St. Martins and St. Stephen.
